 - on European level: support mutual trust in transnational use of VNFIL



What is Peer Review



- External evaluation supporting the reviewed institution
- Aimed on quality development.
- External group of experts (Peers)
- Assess different fields (quality Areas) of the institution
- Peers visit the reviewed institution.
- Peers are external but work in a similar environment
- Peers are independent and 'persons of equal standing'
- Peer Review has been adapted in HE and VET in European projects linked to EQAVET.

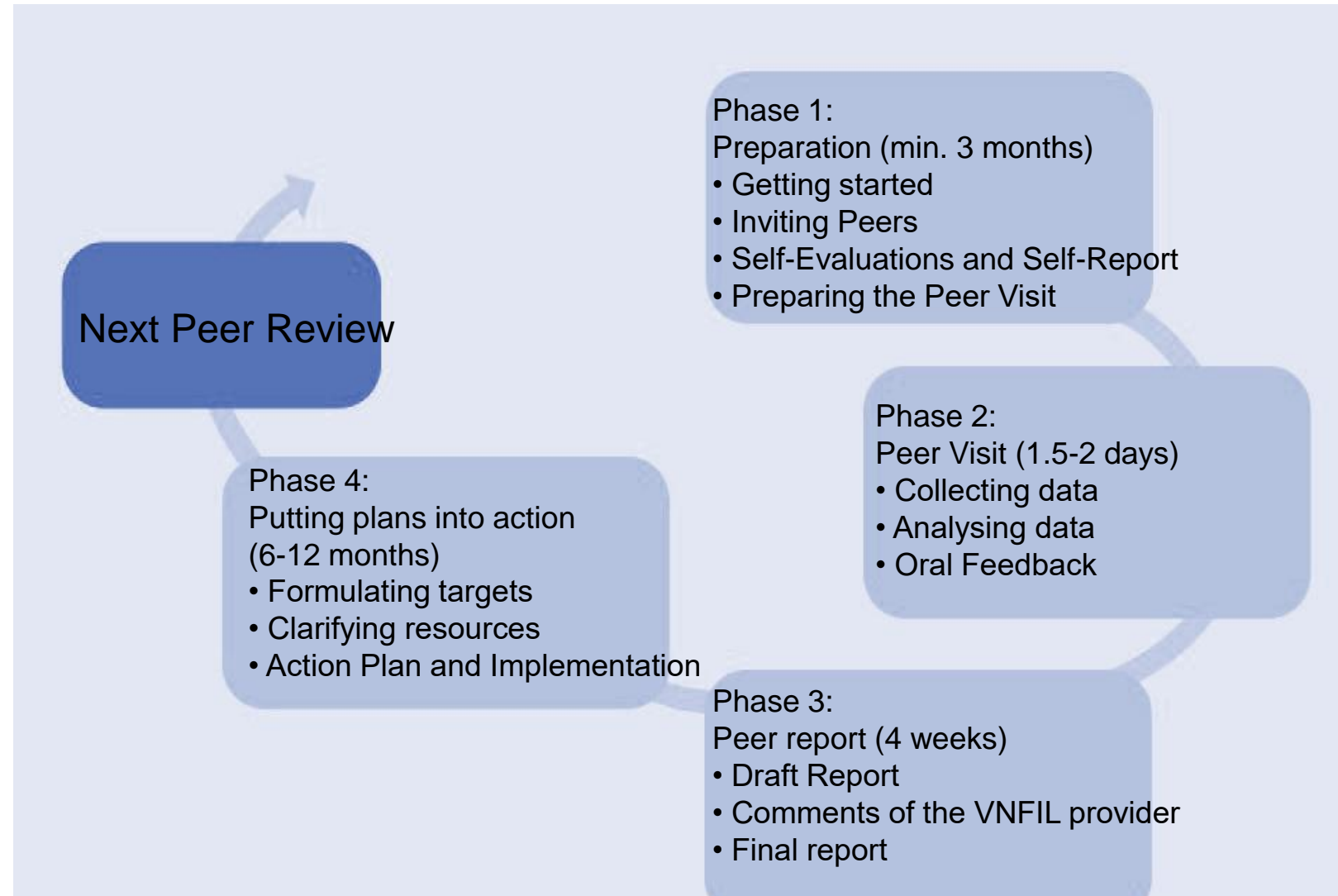

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Why Peer Review?



Starting point:

- wba had 10 years of experience in validation
- only few contacts to other validation providers
- not much international exchange



Reasons for the Peer Review Project

- Quality development of our validation procedures
- Exchange with national and international colleagues
- Building up networks, learning from others



Project progression for wba

- ▶ January 2016: Kick-Off-Meeting in Arnhem (NL)
- ▶ June 2016: 2-day Peer Training in Vienna
 - ▶ Two wba-colleagues were trained as Peers
- ▶ Autumn 2016 - spring 2017: Pilotphase of the project
 - ▶ Dec. 2016: 2,5-day Peer Visit at wba
 - ▶ wba sent Peers to other Peer Visits:
 - ▶ Feb. 2017: Citeforma (Lisbon, Portugal)
 - ▶ March 2017: University of Life Sciences (Vienna, Austria)
 - ▶ April 2017: Frauenstiftung Steyr





Peer Visit at wba

- ▶ Preparation:
 - Decision for Quality Areas
 - Identification of relevant questions within wba
 - Writing of a self report (= self evaluation)
- ▶ Invitation and coordination with Peers
 - one wba-colleague as a „facilitator“
 - Skype-Meetings (Facilitator + Peers)
 - Preparation of an agenda for the Peer Visit
- ▶ 5-7 dec. 2016: Peer Visit at wba

- Find adequate interview partners for the visit

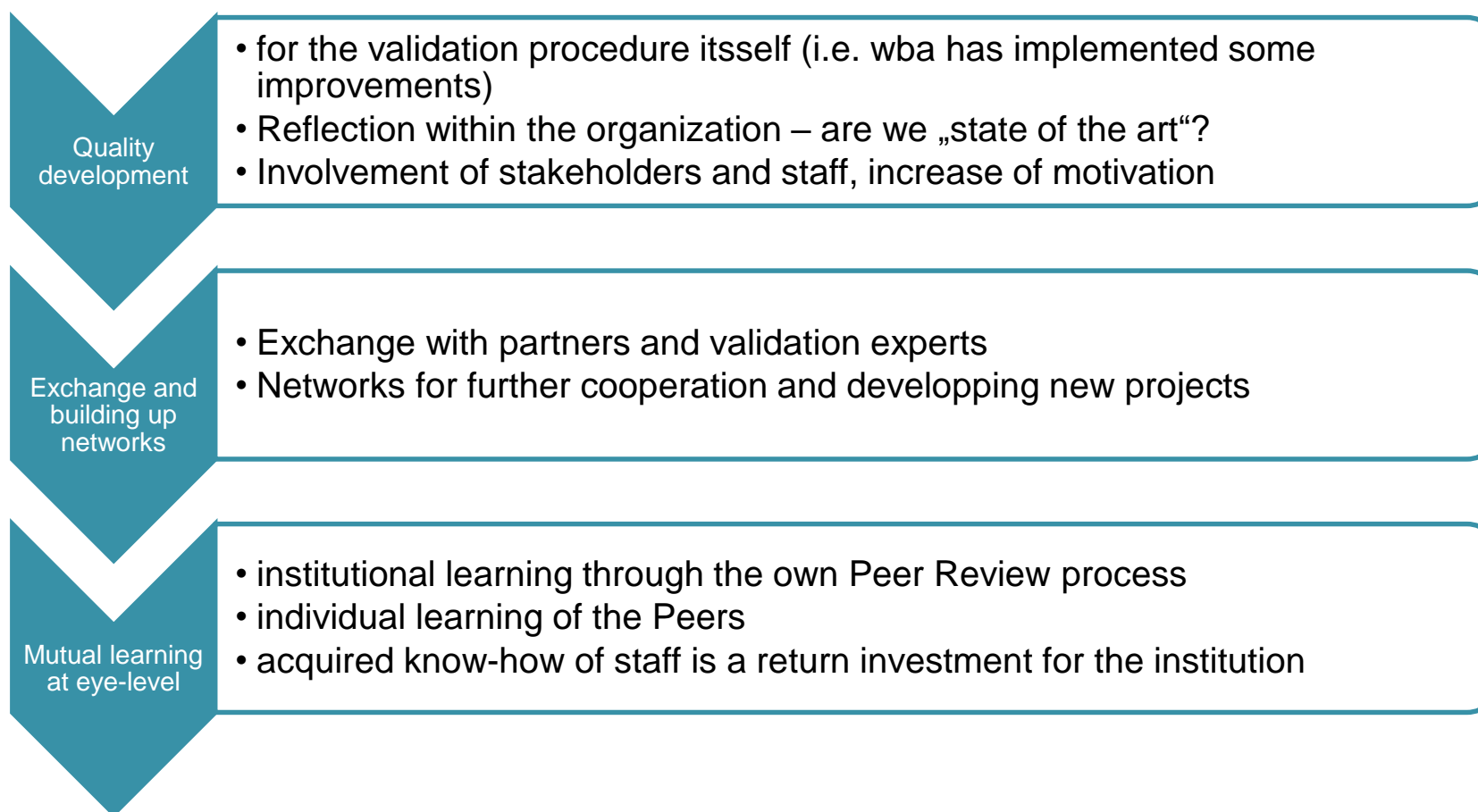
As a Peer:

- Working under time pressure
 - finding results and being able to present them after 2,5 days
 - Understanding other systems, organizations, educational systems...
- Competence in English (team, interview partners...) – translation is time-consuming

General assessment Peer Review



- 55% will conduct a Peer Review again
- 82% recommends Peer Review to others
- 96% recommends being a Peer
- Differences become visible, basis for mutual learning
- Exemplary aspects can be adopted
- Peer Review can be integrated in QA
- Transnational learning from other countries

Challenges for implementing a Peer Review network



- Added value for providers
- Integration in QA (ISO, EFQM, EQAVET)
- Costs and benefits must be equal
- Different languages across Europe
- Different development stages in validation
- Transnational validation candidates
