

In Germany employers and employees agree: Informal and non-formal learning matter most


Relevance of learning pathways for success at work Percentage of "important" and "very important"

Male adults with low levels of formal qualification (below EQF 3) (25 to 54 years)



Mismatch in labour market supply and demand




In Germany 70% of "low skilled" in skilled work. But lack of transparency leads to restricted mobility and income inequality
