

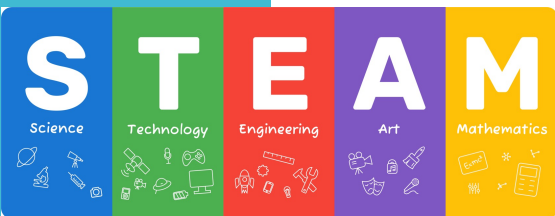


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## Learning to Reflect...

... is about raising one's voice and having it heard

The **objective** of this Surinam project to learn young children to raise their voice in terms of reflecting on who they are, want to be and which steps they have to take to reach out to a positive match in their future career through learning and working.

**Learning to Reflect** is being able to recognise, value and develop one's talents by reflecting on one's own actions and those of others.

Learning **to Reflect** focuses on discovering one's voice:

1. **The small voice** concerns reflecting on one's own actions and the actions of others so that the learner can articulate and use one's own development potential for the benefit of choices to be made in education, the labour market and personal life (= *broad, social education*).
2. **The big voice** concerns reflecting on one's talents in the STEAM (*Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Mathematics*) range (= *STEAM-oriented education*).

Learning to reflect helps young children to understand that all learning matters and that formal, non-formal and informal learning have equal value in their working and learning careers.
